What is the ACC?

The Army Comptroller Course (ACC) provides a basic multi-disciplined financial and resource management overview to DoD civilians & military personnel newly assigned to the Comptroller Career field and to other personnel without a multidiscipline background. The course blends current DoD/Army management and the latest in academic management techniques.

This course was specifically developed for:

- BC 36 Officers
- Enlisted Personnel MOS 36
- Journey-level Army civilian careerists
- Department of the Army CP11 interns in

Class Structure

The course is divided into four general learning objectives with learning accomplished by lectures, group projects, guest speakers, and a Capstone Exercise (a year-of-execution installation-level decrement exercise).

- Approximately 25-30 students per class.
- Guest speakers address real-time application of skills and challenges facing the Army and DoD.
- Capstone Exercise ties all instruction together and requires the students to apply everything they have learned.
- 120 CPEs are awarded: including two (2) hours of Ethics training.

Target Audience:

Civilian

- (CP 11, 26): 2nd year Interns (mandatory), GS 09-11

Military

- (BC/MOS 36): Officer (CPT, MAJ), NCO (SSG (w/waiver), SFC)

Nomination Process:

Submit nominations through command channels to the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Financial Management & Comptroller):

- Letter of Endorsement
- SF 181
- Civilians - CP 11 Resume Form
- Military - Officer Record Brief / Enlisted Record Brief

Funding:

DA centrally funds tuition, per diem, and travel costs for CP 11 careerists and BC 36 officers.

Civilian and military financial managers from the Office of the Secretary of Defense, other defense agencies, DFAS, Department of the Air Force and Department of the Navy may also attend. *Each agency is responsible for tuition, per diem, and travel expenses.*

Administration:

- The ACC is a three-week resident program conducted at the Whitman School of Management, Syracuse University, Syracuse, New York, and SU's Minnowbrook Conference Center in the Adirondack Mountains.
- Classes are conducted from 0800 to 1600 daily with a requirement for several hours of homework each day.
- Pre-course and during course evaluations are done.
- Students should arrive Sunday and depart Friday evening (from Saturday morning) of the third week.
- Students are housed at a contract facility and SU's Minnowbrook Conference Center.
- Transportation by motor coach is provided.
- Tuition covers all training and training material, housing, transportation and some meals.
