What is the SRMC?

The Senior Resource Managers Course (SRMC) discusses current issues in the management of resource management; to better understand the changing resource management environment of the Army and DoD; to provide a venue for senior resource managers to discuss issues and share solutions; and to develop solutions to resource management issues.

Class Structure:

- The course is divided into six general learning objectives with learning accomplished by lectures, guest speakers, and a group project.
- Approximately 25-30 students per class.
- Guest speakers address real-time application of skills and challenges facing the Army and DoD.
- Group projects will be presented to Senior Resource Manager.
- 36 CPEs are awarded: including two (2) hours of Ethics training.

Course Length:

Four and one-half days resident program at Syracuse University and Minnowbrook Conference Center.

Two classes held each fiscal year: spring and summer.

Students completing SRMC receive 30 CPE credits.

Target Audience:

Civilians (CP 11, 26):

- GS 14-15

Military (BS/MOS 36):

- Officer (LTC, COL),
- NCO (SGM/CSM).

Nomination Process:

Submit nominations through command channels to the Office of the Assistant Secretary of the Army (Financial Management & Comptroller):

- Letter of Endorsement
- SF 181
- Civilians - CP 11 Resume Form
- Military - Officer Record Brief / Enlisted Record Brief

Funding:

DA centrally funds tuition, per diem and travel costs for CP 11 careerists and BC 36 Officers and NCOs.

Administration:

- The ECC is a three-week resident program conducted at the Whitman School of Management, Syracuse University, Syracuse, New York, and SU's Minnowbrook Conference Center in the Adirondack Mountains.
- Classes are conducted from 0800 to 1600 daily with a requirement for several hours of homework each day.
- Pre-course and during course evaluations are done.
- Students should arrive Sunday and depart Friday evening (or Saturday morning) of the third week.
- Students are housed at a contract facility and SU's Minnowbrook Conference Center.
- Transportation by motor coach is provided.
- Tuition covers all training and training material, housing, transportation and some meals.
